Statement of Faith

Introduction

So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labor.

Christian Missionary Technical Services Ministries was founded in 1982 by Andy and Nancy Merrick. While missionaries in Peru, they noticed a lack of quality equipment, tools, and training that missionaries needed to accomplish their work and were inspired to create CMTS. Since then, CMTS has developed three main focuses that the ministry functions around: (1) Technical support for existing missions, (2) Training and Discipleship, and (3) Encouraging others in the body of Christ at large while challenging them to serve.

These guidelines are intended to clearly explain the expectations for anyone who desires to serve with CMTS Ministries on a short-term mission trip. Please carefully read this document and bring us any questions you have. *Submit pages 6-8 signed indicating your agreement with rules, requirements, etc.* Participants under 18 must complete and submit the proper release form. This is a living document and can be updated and changed as the need arises.

Short-Term Missions

Volunteer Expectations

- CMTS is an environment to love God, love others, and live a blameless life. (**James 1:14-15; 1 Corinthian 6:20**) **BE A BLESSING**, a *Core Value*
- Attain to Christian living by faith in God's grace. **BELIEF TO BEHAVIOR**, a *Core Value*
- Be committed to working hard towards personal growth, spiritual growth, and people skills. **CONTINUAL GROWTH**, a *Core Value*
- Be available to do mission needs and have a burden for missions purpose.
- Be committed to the trip you are taking and place you are serving. **BE ALL IN**, a *Core Value*
- Be committed to being flexible with the schedule and plans. CMTS trips are always eventful. *"Blessed are the flexible for they won't get bent out of shape"* **BE FLEXIBLE**, a *Core Value*
- Be committed to striving for a positive, thankful attitude each day of the trip. **ATTITUDE OF GRATITUDE**, a *Core Value*
- Be committed to encouraging and lifting each other up. We can't let non-sin issues cause a divide.
- Do everything without murmuring and complaining. (**Philippians 2:14-16**)
- Be an example in all you do. (**1 Timothy 4:12**)
- CMTS volunteers and staff must be faithful, accountable, and teachable. (**2 Timothy 2:2; James 3:1; Proverbs 13:10**)
- The Word of God is the most powerful tool you will ever hold in your hand. Use it to equip yourself and those you influence in the church. (**2 Timothy 3:16-17**)
- "Now as always"... Christianity is not something you do at church. You need to be living your faith before you come and after you go home. (**Philippians 1:20-21**)
- Volunteers and staff must do their best to keep things right among themselves and before the Lord so that we can, with integrity, be examples of the joy that we have in Christ, i.e. smile and mean it because as far as it depends on you, you are right before God and man. (**1 John 1:9; Romans 12:18; Matthew 5:23-24**)
- Foul language, coarse jesting, and slander should not occur.
- Be honest - we are all Christ's ambassadors. (**Proverbs 10:9**)

"For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." - 2 Peter 1: 5-8

Appropriate Conduct & Accountability

- Everyone serving with the opposite sex needs to be mindful of healthy boundaries.
- If in mixed-gender company, try to always be in groups of three or more.
- No inappropriate physical affection between opposite genders.
- Do not inappropriately fraternize with other staff, volunteers, or Equip students. This is a zero-tolerance policy, and you will be asked to leave immediately.
- No men in women's housing and no women in men's housing.
- Be aware of the cultural differences you will experience on your trip, and do your best not to be disrespectful of another country, province, or state's way of life. The goal of the trip is to exemplify and glorify Christ; do not misrepresent Him. **See Romans 14.**

Dress Code

This guideline is not meant to create restrictions or division. As a ministry, we are called to (1) hold each other (students, staff, volunteers, etc.) accountable, and (2) do our best to prevent becoming a stumbling block for others. We welcome any questions or discussions about these guidelines.

- Please pack appropriately for the trip. Take into account the weather, cold evenings, hot days, etc.
- Sweatpants, inappropriate t-shirts, etc. should not be worn.
- Men - *modesty is not just for women*
 - Shirts must be worn at all times
 - Swimsuits must be modest and come down to at least mid-thigh. Rashguard swim shirts are required
- Women
 - Shorts must be mid-thigh or longer
 - Dresses and skirts are to be no more than 4 inches above the knee
 - Leggings are not to be worn as pants
 - No exposed midriffs
 - No plunging necklines extending below your collarbone
 - No off-shoulder shirts going below the top of your shoulder blades
 - Tank top straps must be thick enough to cover bra straps (even if you would wear a strapless bra)
 - Swimsuits must be one-piece or tankini to follow the same rules above

Administration reserves the right to ask any staff to change based on appropriateness of attire

Conflict

- Since we are trying to display a testimony of the unity of Christ's body, staff and volunteers should not be fighting
- If a conflict occurs the appropriate leadership should be notified.
- The biblical model written in **Matthew 18:15-17** is very clear on how we should handle each other in conflict.
 - “If your brother or sister sins:
 1. Go and point out their fault, just between the two of you.
 - *If they listen to you, you have won your brother.*
 2. But *if he does not listen to you,*
 - take one or two more with you, so that by the mouth of two or three witnesses every fact may be confirmed.
 3. If he refuses to listen to them (the two or three witnesses):
 - tell it to the church
 4. If he refuses to listen even to the church,
 - let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.”
- We, as followers of Christ, are the church; if your conflict is ever taken to the third step (“tell it to the church”), CMTS administration is the appropriate leadership to mediate.

“Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism;”

Family & Individual Expectations

- *After committing to the trip by submitting your application & deposit, if you are unable to attend the trip and the plane tickets have already been purchased, you are responsible for covering the cost of the ticket. Airplane tickets are non-refundable.*
- Each person is expected to raise prayer support & financial funding for the trip.
 - Asking others for money to go on a mission trip can seem daunting, but proper perspective is important. Ask for people to partner with you on the trip.
 - See “Support Letter Template”.
- Families participating with young children will remain fully responsible for them and will need to fill out and submit the Minor Application paperwork for each child under 18.
- Do not leave the group at any point. We will provide emergency contact information in the event that you are separated from the group.

Travel

- If traveling by bus/van:
 - Due to insurance reasons, only approved individuals are allowed to drive CMTS vehicles.
 - You will be assigned a seat; do not move or trade seats while on the road, so that we can make sure we have an accurate head count.
 - When we stop to refuel, eat, and use the restroom, you are responsible for purchasing your own snacks and drinks. You are also responsible for your mess; do not leave trash in the bus/van for someone else to clean up.
 - Mixed-gender seating is allowed in groups only, and never alone.
- If traveling by air:
 - Have your passport out and ready.
 - Do not leave the group.
 - Do not make jokes about bombs or guns or other explosive devices.
 - You are responsible for holding your ticket.
 - You are responsible for purchasing any food or drinks after going through TSA.

Addictive Substances Policy

- Alcohol, tobacco, and illegal drugs are not permitted at any time. This includes vapes, e-cigarettes, hookah, vaporizer liquid, and drug paraphernalia/tools. **This is a zero-tolerance policy and you will be asked to return home immediately.**
- All prescription drugs must be labeled with the name of the person taking them. They MUST be labeled and CMTS administration must be informed of all prescription medication. Anyone caught taking or in possession of a prescription drug that is not theirs will be asked to return home immediately. This is an illegal use of prescription meds and is, therefore, an illegal drug.

Support Letter Template

Greeting- Can be formal like, "Dear friends and family" or something informal such as, "Hello!"

Introduction- Introduce yourself (obviously), and the reason you're writing

Body- Give a little backstory. Talk about the decision to come to CMTS, and about what CMTS is. Here's a summary paragraph you can copy/paste:

Christian Missionary Technical Services (CMTS) is a ministry dedicated to supplying and equipping missionaries and other ministries across the globe. Since 1982, CMTS has worked behind the scenes to keep missionaries and other ministries operational. They provide vehicles and mechanical support, technical equipment, specialized supplies and services, and inspiration for others to serve.

Body cont.- After explaining CMTS, talk about what your role here will be, how you're feeling about this big change, etc. Be vulnerable; people will be able to relate better and will be more invested if they feel like they know you better after reading this!

Call to action- Now's the hard part... Asking for financial support, spiritual support, or support of any kind is difficult, but I promise God sees you humbling yourself by putting the weight of your need solely on Him and His ability to soften hearts and open doors. If it is particularly difficult for you to say the words, "I/we need your financial support", do it anyway, and tell people how difficult it is. They understand! Ask for their prayers too! *Specify the amount of support you need!*

Contact- Give them whatever information you are most comfortable handing out: email, phone number, WhatsApp, etc. They'll have questions, so they will want to know the best way to reach you.
